

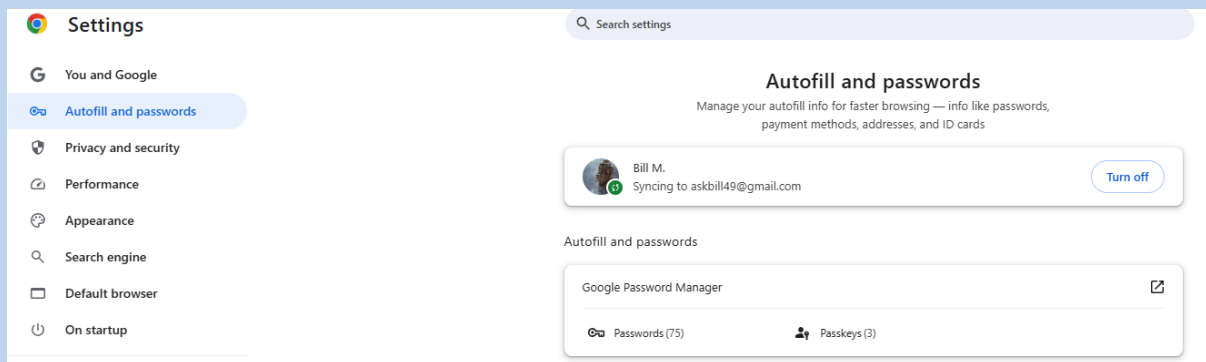
PASSWORDS

Passwords Saved By Your Browser

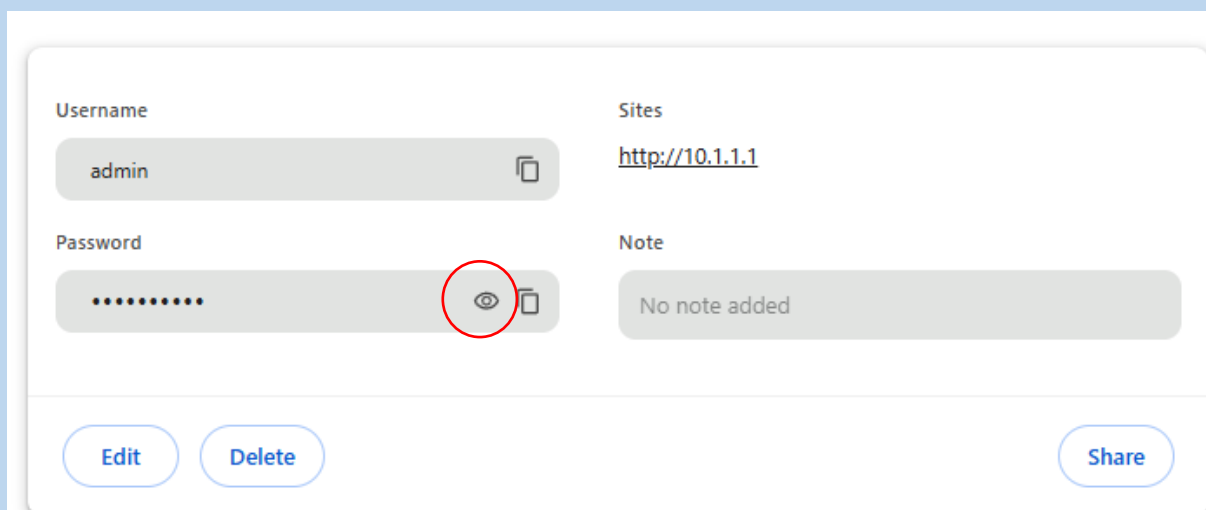
All browsers have the ability to save passwords for web sites you log on to. There are settings in the browser to either allow or disallow this feature.

If the passwords are saved, there are settings where you can view the passwords and even export them to a spreadsheet.

For Chrome click on the three dots in the upper right corner of chrome to open a drop down menu or press ALT+E on your keyboard. In this menu select Settings. In Settings select Autofill and Passwords then select Google Password Manager.



After selecting Google Password Manager you will see of list of site names that have their passwords saved. Click on one of the site names to view the password. You will have to enter your login pin to view the passwords.



Click the icon shown above to view the actual password.

The entire password list can be exported. Over on the left side click on Settings. Scroll down the list and under Export Passwords click on Download File. This will save all the passwords as a CSV file (Excel Spreadsheet).
